St Thérèse of Lisieux Autumn Term Curriculum Letter

This term, we will be learning about **Jurassic Coast**. This letter will give you some key information about what we will be learning this term and how you can support this learning at home. Please see below :

Subject	Content	Supporting your child home
Religious Education	The children will study 3 topics – People, Called and Gifts. In the People topic children learn that the Church names the family the 'Domestic Church' where children may begin to understand the Church which is 'nothing other than the family of God.' In the Called topic children learn that through Baptism and Confirmation people are given the gift of the Holy Spirit and are called to respond in their lives. In the Gifts topic children learn that God's gift of Jesus is a gift of love to all people of all time.	Please ensure that your child knows how to reverently bless themselves and understand the importance of stillness during prayer time. Make a collage using family photographs of all the significant family members—grandparents, parents, children, aunts, uncles etc. who show God's love. Write underneath it "We show God's love to one another." Include those who have died. Talk to someone who has been to a Baptism and/or Confirmation about their memories of this celebration. Find out about some Christian symbols for Advent e.g. Advent wreath, calendar, Jesse tree. Use the CAFOD or Missio websites to get a religious Advent calendar.
English	In reading this term, we will be focussing on the learning behaviours for reading through the use of VIPERS and will be practising using our reading skills. We will be reading two books this term which are Varjak and The Ice Palace. In writing we will be focusing on the books Tar beach, Vermints, Farther and Until I met Dudley. The children will learn a range of GPS skills building up to retelling as a script, writing an explanation text and writing a sequel story.	You can support your child be reading with them each night and asking them questions about what they have read. It is the expectation in KS2 that your child reads three times a week. Each week, your child should fill in two sections of their reading record as part of their reading homework. Please help your child learn their ten weekly spellings that they bring home every Monday.
Maths	In Maths we will continue to follow the Power Maths scheme and use supporting materials from White Rose. We will be focusing first on improving children's place value skills and then using these to develop their knowledge of addition and subtraction. 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	on to perimeter and then multiplication and division. Children will need to continue to learn their multiplication tables and be able to recall each fact, within 6 seconds, from 1x1 to 12x12. The children will sit the new Year 4 multiplication check test in the summer term.	You can also support your child by encouraging them to explain how they got their answer and ask them to explain how they know they are correct. This will deepen their reasoning and problem-solving skills.
Science	This term our topics are sound and electricity. In sound, we will look what a sound is, how a sound is made, how sound travels, how we hear sounds and how sounds change. In electricity, we will look at where electricity comes from, the appliances that run on electricity, how circuits work and electrical conductors and insulators.	Encourage your child to read a range of non-fiction books based on sound and electricity. This will give them an understanding of key vocabulary.
History	This half term we will be focussing on local History – Aveley. We will investigate what was discovered in the clay pits of Aveley which will progress into changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Find and discuss photographs of Aveley in 1964 and discuss what was discovered and by whom.
Geography	Next half term we will learn about hills and coasts around the UK. We will develop our locational knowledge by naming and locating counties and cities of the United Kingdom, develop an understanding of how coasts have changed over time and use fieldwork to observe, measure, record and present the human and physical features in the local area.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Discuss which county we live in, what our neighbouring counties are. Discuss what a coast is and what it might be like to live beside the seaside.
Art	This term the class will be using tone to create a 3D effect, and then they will work collaboratively to develop drawings into prints.	In this day and age, when many children seem to be glued to their screens, please encourage your child to draw at home as frequently as possible. Buying them a pack of felt tipped pens would be a wonderful idea!
Design and Technology	Next half term, the children will be designing and making a pavilion, building a frame structure and then cladding it.	Encourage children to notice buildings with cladding in the local area.
Music	Your child will have the opportunity to learn the recorder. We will be learning basic instrumental skills by playing tunes in varying styles, Using scores/notation as well as learning various song for our Christmas Nativity.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Qy44RtvrSak
Physical Education	For indoor PE our topic will be Yoga and for outdoor PE our topic is Dodgeball. Our PE days are Tuesday and Thursday.	Practise throwing and catching games with your child and let them teach you the yoga poses we learn in school!
PSHE	Using the resources from Ten Ten Resources, our module is Created and Loved by God. It explores the individual. Rooted in the teaching that we are made in the image and likeness of God, it helps children to develop an understanding of the importance of valuing themselves as the basis for personal relationships.	Talk with your child about how everyone is different and an individual.
French	Our topics this term are 'Salut, Gustave!' and 'Quelle heure est-il?'. Children will learn nationalities, characteristics, flags, leisure activities and telling the time all in French!	Encourage your child to practice at home, the French words and phrases that they learn in school

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Computing	We will be studying collaborative learning, Coding with Scratch and Internet safety.	Discuss with your child how to be safe on the internet when using all devices.
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Summer uniform will continue to be worn for the remainder of this half term, until half term when children should return in their winter uniform. We encourage all of the children to wear their uniform with pride. We would also like to remind you again that all items of uniform must be labelled with your child's name. This should avoid you having to replace lost items at great cost! All children must wear black shoes to school and not trainers. Hair accessories should be in the colours of our school uniform: blue, white or yellow. Likewise, please be reminded that hairstyles, including extensions should be **natural** hair colours only.
