Maths	In maths this term, the children will learn about: multiplying and dividing fractions; plotting coordinates, translating and reflecting shapes on coordinate grids and reasoning about shapes presented on coordinate grids; converting between fractions, decimals and percentages; multiplying and dividing decimals; finding percentages of given amounts and solving problems involving percentages; finding and using algebraic rules and solving equations; converting between - and solving problems involving – imperial and metric units of measurement; finding the area and perimeter of shapes including parallelograms and triangles; solving problems involving area and perimeter; finding the volume of a cuboid; solving problems involving ratio, proportion and scale factors and drawing scaled diagrams.	 Ensure that they practice their KIRFs (Key Instant Recall Facts) for this term regularly – these will soon be sent home. Encourage your child to develop as an independent learner by asking them what they need to practice and improve on. For example, if they know that they struggle to add fractions correctly and use their CGP books to practice and improve.
